A message to voters

hile the general election seems to attract more attention from the media and voters, this April's consolidated election should be treated as equally important. The upcoming election consolidates voting for school board members and municipal officials into one election day. This is government at the grassroots level and, in many ways, the consolidated election has more of a direct impact on the lives of local citizens than any other election.

Candidates elected to serve on local school boards, for example, will direct policies which will affect the quality of education for area children over the next few years. Those elected to serve as city aldermen, village trustees and township trustees will help determine the quality of life for citizens at the local level in the near future. The public officials elected in this election will not only make decisions about the level of public services local governmental units will provide, but will also have a hand in determining the taxes residents will pay to support those services. While voter turnout for the consolidated election typically is much lower than for the general election, the consolidated election is a critically important event and I personally urge all registered voters in Macoupin County to take part.

This Voter Information and Election Guide provides information not only about the 2013 consolidated election ballots, but also details about polling places, absentee balloting, early voting and other issues affecting you and the election process. I want to urge you to take time to read this guide prior to visiting the polls this year.

The right to vote is among the most precious of our American liberties. It is both a privilege and an obligation. It is a right enshrined by our forefathers and protected for more than 200 years by generations of military veterans. It is a concept that is still unknown in much of the world in which we live, and I want to personally urge all registered voters to take

time to exercise their right to vote during this election cycle.

This year marks the first year for our new, comprehensive election website-macoupinvotes. com. The state-of-theart website allows voters to



check the status of their voter registration, find the polling place for their precinct, view sample ballots and obtain other information. On election night, the website will be updated regularly with election results so voters will know the outcome of local races as soon as ballots are counted.


It has been my pleasure to administer the 2013 consolidated election in Macoupin County and I deeply appreciate the opportunity to serve the voters of this county.

ON THE COVER: The iconic statue of Abraham Lincoln located on Illinois Route 159 in the center of Bunker Hill is one of only four statues of Lincoln sculpted by William Grandville Hastings. The statue was a gift to the city of Bunker Hill from Captain Charles Cinton, formerly of Company B of the First Missouri Voluntary Cavalry, in recognition of the numerous Bunker Hill men who served in Company B during the Civil War. An estimated 7,000 people attended the unveiling and dedication of the monument on Sept. 7, 1904. Among those attending was Illinois Governor Richard Yates and Senator Shelby M. Collum. At least nine Company B veterans from Macoupin County also attended, along with Capt. Clinton.



Early Voters must be registered voters with a valid picture ID showing their current voter registration address. No excuse or reason is necessary to take advantage of Early Voting. Any vote cast during the Early Voting period is final and may not be revoked. Early Voters are not eligible to vote on Election Day.

Have you moved?

If you have moved, changing your voter registration is required

If you are a registered voter in Macoupin County and have moved within Macoupin County, you need not re-register to vote. All you need to do is complete a change of address form. This form is required in order to vote, un-

less you have moved within 30 days prior to the dress in person at our office, with a deputy regelection. The last day to change your address is Tuesday, March 12, 2013. You may change your address by completing and signing the back of your voter identification card and returning it to: Macoupin County Clerk, P.O. Box 107, Carlinville, IL 62626. You may also change your ad-

istrar, or online at www.macoupinvotes.com by simply printing out the form and mailing it to the Macoupin County Clerk's office. If you have moved within 30 days of the election, you may vote in your old precinct by signing a Voter Affidavit.

Find your polling place online

- 1. Go to www.macoupinvotes.com
- 2. Then click "Voter Lookup" underneath the pictures of the sites in Macoupin County.
- 3. Enter your voter registration information. You must enter the information exactly as it appears on the voter file, which is exactly as you wrote it when your registered. If your regis-

tration information does not immediately appear, try your legal name or old address.

- **4.** Once your information comes up, select "View Polling: under the "My Electons" section.
- **5.** Your polling place, a picture of the building and the ability to Google map the location will appear on screen. Click on the red "Google mapit" to go to Google maps.

Find your voting districts before election day

You can use the internet to find the voting districts in which you are eligible to vote by following these steps.

- 1. Go to www.macoupinvotes.com
- 2. Then click "Voter Lookup" underneath the pictures of the sites in Macoupin County.
- 3. Enter your name and zip code.

- 4. Then scroll down the page to "Voter Links" and click "My Districts."
- **5.** There is a list of your districts whose offices you are entitled to vote for on Election Day. If you believe the list should be different, please contact the Election Office at (217) 854-3214, extension 707.





Early voting options

Voters who wish to cast early ballots for the April 9 consolidated election have three options available to them:

Vote by Mail

Voters who would like to vote by mail can call the Election Office to request an application. The last day for the Election office to receive a mailed application is Thursday, April 4th. All mailed ballots must be postmarked by midnight on Monday April 8th.

In-Person Voting

starting Monday March 25th through Saturday, April 6th. The Election Office is located at the Courthouse and is open Monday through Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. with special hours from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. on Saturday, April 6th. Voters are required to bring a photo i.d. to vote early at the Election Office.

Grace Period Voting

Any voter who failed to register or change their registration before the deadline may grace period vote at the Election Office start-Voters may vote early at the Election Office ing Wednesday, March 13th through Saturday

April 6th. When registering to vote during the grace period, voters must show two valid pieces of identification, one of which shows the current address of residence.

Any voters with questions should contact the Election Office during office hours (8:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.) at 217 854-3214. The Election Office is located in the Macoupin County Courthouse at 201 East Main, Carlinville.

Voters are reminded that if they vote early, their vote is final and they may not change their vote.

★ Make Democracy Work! ★★ Become an Election Judge ★

Election judges help guarantee the rights of voters are protected on election day. This page details the qualifications necessary to become an election judge and also some of the important duties and responsibilities.

What are judges of election?

Judges of election are responsible for the administration of election procedures in the polling place on election day. They are in the position of ensuring that the election process is administered fairly and in accordance with our laws.

What are the qualifications necessary to be an election judge?

- ❖ Be a citizen of the United States.
- ❖ Be of good repute and character.
- Be able to speak, read and write the English language.
- ❖ Be of good understanding and capable.
- Not be an elected committeeman.
- Need to be registered to vote in the county.
- Each Election Judge is required to declare their party preference so they can be assigned accordingly. (See how judges are selected in the following section.)

How are judges selected?

Election Judges are chosen by the County Clerk and by the Party Chairpersons. The party which cast the highest average number of votes at the most recent three gubernatorial elections in the precinct shall be represented by three judges, the party which casts the second highest number of votes at the most recent three gubernatorial elections in the precinct shall be represented by two judges.

How are election judges trained?

Before each election, several election judge training schools will be held. This course covers the duties and responsibilities of election judges and an examination which tests reading skills, ability to work with poll lists, ability to add and knowledge of election laws governing the operation of polling places is given every two years. Judges who have attended and completed the class will receive \$160 for their duties on election day. Judges who have not attended and completed the class will receive \$150 for their duties on election day.

What are some of the duties of the judges of election?

- Open and close the polls.
- Be responsible for election materials.
- Ensure that only qualified voters are permitted to vote and that each qualified voter is permitted to vote once and only once
- Give instructions in the method of voting when requested by a voter.
- Give assistance to illiterate and physically disabled voters.
- Maintain order in the polling place throughout the day.
- ❖ Tally the votes after the polls are closed; and to certify the election results in that precinct.

How may I become an election judge?
