## MACOUPIN COUNTY CLERK NOW ACCEPTING REQUESTS TO VOTE BY MAIL

County News: January 1, 2018

**Carlinville** - Macoupin County voters may now apply for a vote by mail ballot for the March 20, 2018 Primary Election, Macoupin County Clerk Pete Duncan announced.

Voters have been able to apply since December  $20^{\rm th}$  and ballots will be sent out starting February  $8^{\rm th}$ .

"Although the Election is still just under 80 days away, voters can request a ballot now and it will be delivered to your mailbox in mid-February," Duncan said. "Applying now is the first step towards being able to vote from your own home at your convenience."

Duncan stressed that the Macoupin Election Office is now offering multiple ways to apply. Anyone can request a ballot online through MacoupinVotes.com, by phone, mail or in person.

Duncan stressed that applying online takes less than a minute and will remove a few steps of snail mail, making it more efficient for voters and the Election's office. Voters will need the last four digits of their Social Security number, their driver's license or state identification card, and an email address. That information will be verified before the application is processed by the Election Office.

Duncan said he hopes greater numbers of Macoupin County voters take advantage of voting by mail or early voting in order to avoid congestion at the polls on Election Day. In the last presidential election about 16 percent of Macoupin votes were cast before Election Day. He said he hopes for a higher percentage this year.

Duncan did remind everyone that regardless of how the voter applies, the signature on their ballot certification will be compared against the signature in their voter file by a team of Democratic and Republican Election judges before their ballot is counted.

Duncan did remind voters that state law requires that ballots will begin being mailed on February  $8^{\rm th}$  so voters should wait to check to see if their ballot has been mailed until mid-February.
